

NWFAEP Scholarship–2023 Application

The Northwest Chapter of the Florida Association of Environmental Professionals (NWFAEP) is awarding one (1) \$1,000 scholarship (as a one-time lump sum distribution) to a college student, who is interested in pursuing or is currently pursuing an environmental-related career and might need financial assistance. The recipient will receive a check intended to help with the expenses of furthering their education. The winner will be announced by January 31, 2024.

Instructions: Please read the instructions carefully and fulfill all of the requirements. An unofficial transcript and letter of recommendation must be submitted with the application package. The application must be submitted as a complete package. Applicants should respond with N/A to parts of the application that they feel are not pertinent. Contact the NWFAEP with questions at nwfaep@gmail.com. All application materials must be submitted to the NWFAEP Chapter at nwfaep@gmail.com by January 2, 2024 to be eligible for the award. It is the applicant's responsibility to confirm receipt of the submitted application package.

Eligibility Requirements:

•Minimum 3.0 grade point average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale.

•Resident of Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, Walton or Bay Counties or attending an accredited college or university in any of these counties.

•Be a student enrolled in an environmental-related degree program at an accredited college or university, including but not limited to Marine Biology, Environmental Science, Environmental Studies, Geology, Environmental or Civil Engineering, or Biological Sciences.

•Submit a completed application package by the due date, including required attachments (official transcript(s), letter of recommendation, and essay).
